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PLANNING of activities leading to workshop

Setting up of new website (suggestions for name of website urgently needed by 16th November!): calendar. All schools fill in calendar with school holidays	<i>End of November</i>	Matthias and web team, Munich Then all partners

Preparation of a digital folder for each country introducing different work teams, info, photos, contacts of coordinators (students and teachers), ways of communication	<i>End of January</i>	All partners

Workshop in Heerde, 25th February-1st March 2013

For each country 10-12 students and 2-3 teachers will participate

Transport: the possibility of hiring a bus will be considered

Transport from-to airport: will be considered if bus is shared and not too expensive

- Students from other countries bring materials and outcome of activities, slides for presentation will be actually prepared together during the workshop by an international group

- Possible visits: water cleaning facility; waste collection plant; second hand/charity shop.
- 3 main area of work, three work groups:
- Video/photos, "triple" video interviews on questions and issues arisen during the workshop
- Production of slides (presentation) on the results of survey; on those of webquest
- Preparation of debate. Choosing appropriate statements for debate (i.e.: Buying second hand clothes is good for you and for the environment"), keeping the debate "alive" (preparation of arguments)

For each work group: approximately 10 students.

At the end of each workshop a freecard with a good practice, a key word or sentence will be designed by the Turin students

Other results that can be produced by the end of the 1st or 2nd year: flyer, stickers, e-book, sustainable product packaging.
